1. INTERPROFESSIONAL STROKE REHABILITATION TEAM			
The inpatient stroke rehabilitation service includes all members of the core team and has access to the other professions listed.			
2. STROKE EXPERTISE			
2.1 Core Skill Sets, Knowledge & Training			
<i>The manager should review Table 1 (from the service standards document) with all team members.</i> Each team member has achieved or learned the appropriate skill sets, knowledge, and/or training required for their discipline, based on the recommended learning/resources provided in the service standard document.			
2.2 Continuing Education			
During the past year, the inpatient stroke rehabilitation service has assessed the team's learning needs and has addressed (or has a plan to address) gaps in knowledge.			
All of the team members are engaged in continuing education.			
2.3 Treatments & Therapies			
Treatment/therapy provided to stroke patients is evidence-based and: - is direct and task/goal specific, - includes repetitive and intense use of tasks that challenge the patient to gain the skills needed to perform functional tasks and activities, and - promotes the practice and transfer of skills to the patient's daily routine.

3. FREQUENCY AND INTENSITY OF STROKE REHABILITATION			
All stroke patients receive therapy that is direct and task/goal specific and provided on a one-to-one basis by the interprofessional stroke rehabilitation team for a minimum of three (3) hours per day, five (5) days per week.			
4. SERVICE DELIVERY			
4.1 Staffing Ratios Staffing ratios are sufficient to support the frequency and level of intensity of rehabilitation outlined above.			
4.2 Location of Inpatient Stroke Rehabilitation The rehabilitation unit is geographically defined. (If yes, advance to section 4.3).			
Inpatient rehabilitation provided on a general rehabilitation unit incorporates the Canadian Best Practice Recommendations for Stroke Rehabilitation.			
A physician with expertise/core training in stroke rehabilitation is available (on the general rehab unit or by consultation).			
4.3 Interprofessional Team Meetings Interprofessional rehabilitation team meetings where patients are discussed are consistently held at least once per week.			
4.4 Discharge from Inpatient Stroke Rehabilitation Discharge needs assessments are conducted for all stroke patients before they are discharged from the inpatient stroke rehabilitation service.
